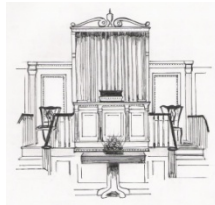

Hope will format the newsletter on Tuesdays, and it will be emailed out first thing on Wednesdays.

## FIRST PARISH BOOK GROUP

The bookworms of the First Parish Book Group meet the **first Wednesday of each month** at 7 pm in the Fogg Parlor. All are welcome – come to one discussion or come to them all!

Wednesday, October 7: “Mayflower: A Story of Courage, Community and War” by Nathaniel Philbrick

Wednesday, November 4: **NEW BOOK SELECTION!**

Rev. Lise will lead this special discussion of “Just Mercy: A Story of Justice and Redemption” by Bryan Stevenson. This is the UUA’s “Common Read” book for the year. We will be ordering a couple of copies for the church’s library – please contact the Church Office if you are interested.

What is the one commonality of people on death row? If the victim is white, the perpetrator is 11 times more likely to be condemned to die than if the victim is black. When Stevenson was a 23-year-old Harvard law student, he started an internship in Georgia where his first assignment was to deliver a message to a man living on death row. This assignment became his calling: representing the innocent,

the inadequately defended, the children, the domestic abuse survivors, the mentally ill—the imprisoned. This fast-paced book reads like a John Grisham novel.

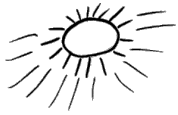
Boston Cello Quartet

## FROM THE DRE

Hello First Parish!



We've gotten a great jump on this church year, and I can't wait to see you all at some of our upcoming events. First up is our monthly game night and potluck, happening this coming **Friday, October 2** from 6-9 pm. Bring your favorite dish and your favorite game to share!

This coming, Sunday the children of First Parish will be welcoming a speaker from the Carolina Hill Shelter who will be talking about their programs and how people of all ages can help out. Later, on 10/25 a group from First Parish will go to their location in Marshfield, serve a meal, meet the residents, and do some fun crafts with the children there.

But wait, Religious Education isn't just for kids! On **Wednesday, October 14** at 7 pm we will be starting our first Adult RE class of the year, which will take place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month. "Faith Like a River: Themes from Unitarian Universalist History" examines the historical and theological movements which brought our religion into being. Each class is stand alone, and offered at no cost to those in and outside of the congregation. The first class is called: Against the Flow: Orthodoxy and Heresy, and discusses some of the very beginnings of Unitarian and Universalist thought, as well as their denunciation as heresy. This class will help you gain a general understanding of UU history, and is strongly recommended for those who did not grow up in Unitarian Universalism. I hope to see you there!

Finally, we're also looking for adults and youth with an interest they wish to share as part of our "Mini-Sessions" classes. This time between our regular Sunday School semesters divides the RE children up by interest rather than age, allowing you to share your favorite hobby with a group of many ages, and lots of enthusiasm!
