HELEN FOGG SERVICE COMMITTEE

A big thank you to Scott Babcock, who has been the chair of the Helen Fogg Service

Committee for the last two years. Stepping in as co-chairs this year are Noel Constantino and Beverly Gardner.

"In the spirit of the words of our covenant — `to minister to each other's needs and to those of humanity' — the Helen Fogg Service Committee empowers the ministry of social justice and outreach at First Parish by serving as a conduit for outreach to the wider community locally, nationally and internationally." (Copied from the church's web site.)

Usually, the Committee has a line item in the church's budget with which to work. Due to disappointing canvass results, our committee and several other church committees are doing without funding from the church this church year.

With the money the church usually gives us, we augment the plate money which you parishioners give at the Second Sunday service (now known as "Service Sunday") where our committee highlights a particular cause or Money is also donated to worthy causes as needed during the church year, and at the end of the fiscal year, whatever is left over in our budget is allocated to other charities. Last June, \$6,103 remained. committee as a whole voted to put the money into a special bank account to be spent helping our former Partaker's prisoner, now a free woman, Carolyn Gunter, with her education. Carolyn is a special case in that due to the fact that she was deported to her home country of Jamaica on a technicality, she simply cannot get a job there since she is a deportee. She has

tried mightily the last two years, sending out myriad resumes and volunteering at several Her First Parish mentors and good friends, Mary Mercier, Marcia Babcock and Beverly Gardner, know in our hearts that Carolyn is a good person who will do well in whatever she does, but in Jamaica, she just can't get a job. Carolyn researched the job situation in Jamaica and learned that Special Education teachers are sorely needed, and that as a deportee with a Master's degree in Special Ed., she would be able to work and contribute to society. The Service Committee voted to use the leftover budgeted money for the church year 2013-2014 to help Carolyn work towards that Master's degree. The money will be sent, semester to semester, until it runs out and should pay about half of her total tuition for the degree. Carolyn is truly touched, excited and appreciative.

FROM THE TREASURER'S DESK

Dear Members and Friends,

I wanted to give you a brief update on financial matters, prior to presentation of the detailed report that I present at the October Special Parish Meeting.

Fiscal Year 14

Fiscal Year 14 closed on 6/30/2014. I am happy to report that we ended the fiscal year with a surplus of approximately \$15,000. This surplus resulted from:

- Lower than expected expenses, primarily utility savings resulting from the solar panel installation and conversion to gas heat (approximately \$8,300)
- Greater than expected pledges (approximately \$3,300)
- Greater than expected endowment income (approximately \$1,600)
- Greater than expected facility use income (approximately \$1,800)

Use of this surplus will be discussed by the Parish and Finance Committees. Even though we ended the year with a surplus, **there are still a few pledges outstanding**. If you have not completed your 2014 pledge, we ask that you please do so.

Fiscal Year 15

Fiscal Year 15 began on 7/1/2014 and ends on 6/30/2015.

As I reported at the June Special Parish Meeting, the FY15 budget was extremely challenging due to the decline in pledges. As a result, several requests could not be accommodated. Most significantly, the Service Committee budget had to be completely eliminated and there were no salary increases.

If you have not already done so, I would encourage you to consider making a pledge commitment. If you are new to our congregation, and would like to learn more about pledging and stewardship, please contact the Office Administrator, Hope Weinman (781-659-7122 x10 or office@firstparishnorwell.org), who will direct you to the appropriate person.

The FY15 Canvass reached out to 98 pledging units. The number of pledges received was 92, or 93.9%. I have summarized the pledge results below.

Welcome back First

Parish of Norwell!

We're in the middle of our summer services right now, and your Religious Education committee and I are gearing up for the beginning of Sunday school, along with some of the Adult Religious Education workshops which we talked about last year.

Our Religious Education brochure will be complete and available at our first Sunday service in September, and will detail all of the different offerings for both adults and children. Some of the adult programs we'll be running this year include Dream Interpretation with Rev. Len DeRoche, Art Appreciation, Pub Theology, Path to Membership classes, and I will be leading the UUA program "Resistance and Transformation: Unitarian Universalist Social Justice History".

Complete descriptions and sign-ups will be available in the Parish Hall starting on September 7.

Our programming for children and youth is also coming right up. Our first official event for the year will be on **Saturday**, **September 6**, where we will be gathering in the Parish Hall for a movie night for families. We will be showing "Avatar" (rated PG-13) on our big screen media center, and supplying popcorn. After the movie, our high school age youth will be having a sleepover at the church, before cooking a pancake breakfast on the morning of our first service. Get to the church around 9:00 am on the 7th for pancakes and community!

Finally, our Sunday school classes will begin on **September 14**. Each of our age groups will be focusing on a particular part of Unitarian Universalism, and will learn about many aspects of religion and the world throughout the year.

The Pre-K-Kindergarten class will be using the new curricula: Wonderful Welcome. The Wonderful Welcome curriculum engages and challenges leaders and children alike to explore how and why we are willing to welcome others into our lives. We welcome not only strangers, but family, our peers, our neighbors and even entities that are not people such as our animal friends and nature itself.

The 1st-3rd grade class will be running the program: In Our Hands. In Our Hands is a peace and social justice curriculum which looks at the world around us, and helps the students to expand their ideas about how they can positively impact the world around them. The program focuses on both the ends and means, the ideals and realities that feed into being a complete person and helping others.

The 4th-6th grade class will be using the program Timeless Themes. This program focuses on the stories of the Hebrew and Christian Bibles. These stories have been instrumental in our society for thousands of years, and understanding these stories can be an important part of understanding religion as a whole. We will be examining some of the better known, and some of the lesser known stories, and talking about how they can be meaningful in our lives, and in the development of our religious beliefs.


Our 7th and 8th grade class will be using the Our Whole Lives curriculum. Last year I wrote a couple of longer articles about the

importance of the OWL curriculum. This time I'll simply describe it as a sexuality and relationships program for youth. This is a very useful, deep, and meaningful program, and as a result we require that students commit to attending each class. Finally, our Youth Group will be continuing our biweekly meetings on Sunday nights. Our first Youth group meeting of the year will be on **September 14** at 5:00pm.
