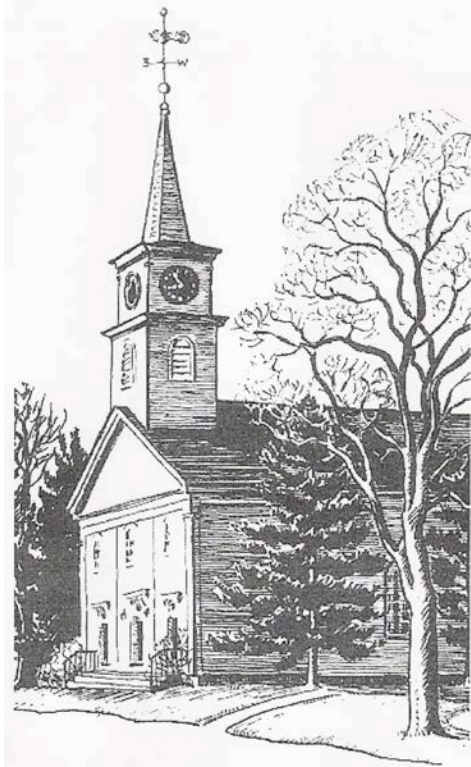

We all had a good afternoon with Dick and his family and it was wonderful seeing many long-time members returning to the Meetinghouse. The Alliance's seasonal bouquet was particularly spectacular. Your decorating of the Meetinghouse these past Sundays with beautiful floral displays shows a certain commitment to First Parish that is being reflected in your process of search.

Last month I officiated at a memorial service for a gifted and popular Norwell High School student. While this was a sad event, the

community response says so much about your community here in Norwell and the South Shore in general. I have never experienced such a community response and I don't impress easily. The schools dismissed early. The school superintendent and a principal ushered. All the young people thought enough of their fellow student that they dressed appropriately for a memorial service. The Cushing Center was filled for the reception. This is the type of community spirit that should assure you that First Parish will have many potential ministers applying to your congregation.

Thanks to all the families that have invited me for a home cooked meal. You have all been so generous. I am also going to have a holiday open house at the Parsonage again on December 20 if the kitchen is complete. Please put the date on your calendar.

COME SING A SONG WITH ME...

You may have noticed our new supplemental hymnals, "Singing the Journey", which we have begun using each Sunday. This hymnal is widely used in congregations across the denomination and was created, according to the UUA website, to provide "fresh hymns, chants or songs that enliven worship; music for marking the seasons in the lives of our congregations; and music in a number of

different styles including jazz, folk, pop, spirituals, gospel, praise songs, call-and-response, chants, rounds and traditional hymns."

The choir has had copies of this hymnal for a number of years, but our congregation has not. The plan was to purchase 40 from the FY2014 budget, which was done, and 40 from the FY2015. Unfortunately, the funding for the FY 2015 budget was cut. With only 40 hymnals for the congregation, they must be handed out each week by the ushers and typically shared by two or more people.

As we did when we purchased the grey hymnals, we are encouraging families and individuals to purchase hymnals for the congregation. A bookplate with your family's name(s) will be placed inside. Hymnals may also be purchased in memory of or in honor of someone. Each hymnal is \$18. In addition, we would like to order two large print editions, which are \$25 each. There will be order forms in the Parish Hall. If you are willing to help, please fill out the form and attach your check or cash and put in the Church Office. Thank you!

HOLLYWOOD COMES TO NORWELL!

By now, many of you have heard that Disney is now filming a movie on the South Shore and Cape Cod. "The Finest Hours" tells the story of the daring Coast Guard rescue of the crew of an oil tanker that broke up and sunk off the coast of Scituate in 1952. The movie will star Chris Pine and Eric Bana. The cast and crew have been headquartered at the former Fore River Shipyard in Quincy, where an enormous water tank has been built to film the action sequences. On the nights of Monday, **December 1 and Tuesday, 2**, they will be filming a scene at the Cushing Center here in Norwell Center depicting a dance. The production company has rented our Parish Hall, and will be using it as a cafeteria and staging area for the cast and crew. Here's what you need to know:

- The production company will be parking two mobile kitchens in the parking lot in front of the carriage barns. They will arrive mid-afternoon on December 1, and will remain on site until the morning of December 3.
- There is no filming taking place on church property.
- The cast and crew will be arriving mid/late afternoon on December 1 and 2. Actual filming at the Cushing Center will begin once it gets dark, and will continue until it begins to get light the next morning.
- The Monday night AA meeting will be meeting instead at the Grange Hall on Main Street. Tuesday morning tai chi will be meeting in the Skylight Room.

- The Church Office and Preschool will be open as usual. However, parking will be *extremely* limited. There will be detail police officers assisting with traffic control, especially when the preschool students are being dropped off and picked up. If you have church business to take care of during this time, you are encouraged to do it via phone or email if at all possible.
- The office staff have NOT been given walk on roles in the movie!
- The anticipated release date of the movie is December 2015.

SEARCH COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Sunday, October 26, 2014

Review of Congregational Record: We worked on refining the Congregational Record, which will be sent to our Ministerial Search Representative, Laura Graham as well as Rev. Len. The congregation will also have an opportunity to view it in early November. We are greatly indebted to Sally Turner and Mary Nickerson for their monumental efforts to compose this lengthy document which details who we are at First Parish of Norwell and will be very inviting to prospective ministers. Bernie Gardner and Marie Miller also worked weekly to assist the sub-committee with the Congregational Record, along with input from Ingrid Carlson.

Update of Survey: "Survey Monkey" and Bernie Gardner have compiled the findings of the Survey. We will be making the results visible to the congregation via an online link, a few hard copies, and by a laptop set up in the Parish Hall. We are so pleased that we had 95 church members participating and voicing

their candid responses on the Survey which will be a valuable part of our Congregational Record and packet.

Beyond Categorical Thinking Reflections: The service and workshop were very worthwhile. The consensus by those in attendance at the workshop was that there were no concerns that we should be restricted by any categories in our ministerial selection. Ellie Handleman took notes and has a report which will be placed in the packet and made available to the congregation.

Next steps with the packet and viewing of the Congregational Record for the congregation: The hard copies of the Congregational Record will be posted on the Search Committee Bulletin Board, and electronic links will be provided. The committee will continue to meet to add more information to the packet and complete it by early December.

Compensation Package Update: Scott Babcock, Marta Reese, and Sue Sulc have worked on a range of the compensation wages for the newly settled prospective Minister, based on a formula and calculation suggested by the UUA which places our church in a category according to size of congregation and geographical location.

Ministerial Search Web Page created by Debi Meddaugh: Our webmaster, Debi Meddaugh, has created a Search Committee web page for the congregation and we will send her the completed CR and Survey, after approval by Laura Graham. She will also create a page for the prospective ministerial candidates where they can access all the information for the packet.

Bios and Photos for the Packet: Search Committee members agreed that we will place photos and bios of the committee in the packet, which will hopefully demonstrate to the candidates a cross-section of our church community and feel welcomed by the “friendly faces” of the Search Committee.

Meeting Next Sunday, November 2: Since our next scheduled meeting conflicts with the Celebration for Dick Fewkes on Sunday, Nov. 2, we will postpone our meeting until November 9.

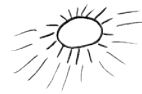
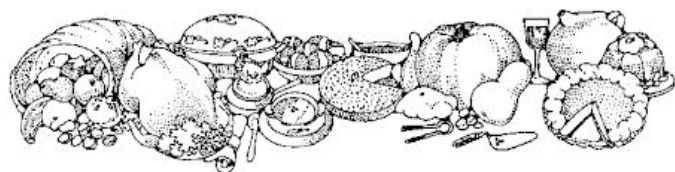

This November in the RE program we have some great programs planned for you. For the adults of our congregation we will be beginning the Tapestry of Faith course "Resistance and Transformation: Unitarian Universalist Social Justice History". This course was written by Rev. Colin Bossen and Rev. Julia Hamilton and focuses on the belief that even "failures" in our history can be instructive. This program presents the ongoing struggle of our tradition to live up to its ever-evolving ideals of social transformation. Themes include abolition, peace-making, civil rights, free speech, utopianism, counter-culture, the women's movements of both 19th and 20th centuries, sexuality education, and LGBT equality.

This course will begin **Wednesday, November 19** at 7:00, and continue every other week. We have a bunch of people signed up already, so please contact me if you wish to attend.

For the youth of our congregation we will be co-hosting a Youth Conference called **UnCONventional** with the Scituate, Cohasset, and Rockland UU congregations. The show will be presented at 7 pm on **December 4, 5 and 6**. Tickets are \$12 and available at the box office an hour before performance time. Preparation for the show has come to involve many facets of the high school community, in both academic and non-academic arenas: psychology, art, technical education, the school's guidance department, and the Norwell Design Center are all involved in various ways. The school's Diversity Club is discussing ways in which it might incorporate the show into its work, and a short informative film about the show is in the planning stages.
