March 12: **Stewardship Sunday**

Every year we reconsider our financial situation, our needs and our wants at First Parish of Norwell. It's a time to think about where we'd like to go and how we'd like our community to be involved with each other and our larger world. Now more than ever, it's important to have a voice that will stand for inclusion and honoring everyone's worth. How do we want to sponsor these beliefs in our world?

For many years each spring we have participated in a UU Union Sunday morning service at one of the nearby Unitarian Universalist congregations. This year we (the ministers of our five congregations) have decided to host instead an afternoon UU Union Celebration: **"Singing for the Earth"** - to be held here at FPNUU on **Sunday, March 12** at 3 pm in the Meetinghouse. 

WHY YOU SHOULD CONSIDER INCREASING YOUR PLEDGE?

Hello, fellow members and friends of FPNUU!

I am writing to you as the Treasurer, a member of the Finance Committee and a long time member of our beloved church. By now, everyone should have received a letter from the Finance Committee asking you to pledge as generously as possible to our Fiscal Year 2018 budget. In the letter, you are being asked to increase your pledge and I wanted to give you some of the reasons behind that request.

Our church is in the fortunate position of having a significant endowment, which, in the past few years, has provided income to cover about 42% of our expenses. Pledges from members and friends have covered about 40% of expenses. Rental income and other miscellaneous income have covered the remaining 18% of expenses. In Fiscal Year 2017, a component of other miscellaneous income noted above was a draw-down from our savings account in the amount of \$9,000. This is a not a measure that we want to have to rely on each year.

In Fiscal Year 2017, we are expecting to receive pledges of approximately \$130,000. Our pledge goal for the Fiscal Year 2018 is \$160,000. Here are the things we want to support through increased pledges.

- A 3% wage increase to our incredibly talented Minister who provides inspiring worship services, and staff members who provide amazing Religious Education programming, over the top Music during worship, critical Administrative Support and exceptional Building and Ground maintenance.
- An estimated 10% increase in health insurance benefits;
- Sending two delegates to the General Assembly in New Orleans and being able to cover not only their registration, but their travel and lodging;

- Being a 100% fair share contributor to the UUA and the Ballou Channing District (which represents a cost of \$79 per church member) ;
- A \$500 increase to the Music Committee to cover summer services, which is now a part of our routine church programming;
- Increasing our contribution to the Helen Fogg Service Committee for their important social justice work from \$2,000 to \$4,000; and
- A significant contribution to the Capital Improvement Fund to take care of our beautiful, but aging, buildings which include the Meetinghouse, Parish Hall, Parsonage, Kent House and the James Library.

I hope we can all rally and grow our pledges to support these endeavors. As you all know, over the last few years, some generous supporters have passed on or moved away. While we have been fortunate to have some new families join our church community, we have not been able to attain past levels of support. If everyone was able to increase their respective pledges, we would go a long way in achieving our canvass goal for Fiscal Year 2018.

We are such an incredible church community - thank you for considering increasing your support!

HELEN FOGG SERVICE COMMITTEE

For 375 years, your congregation has been working to change this community for the better through individual and group action. This year, our Changing Hearts and Lives by Inspiring Community Efforts, or *CHALICE*, is the Outreach/Social Service part of our 375th celebration. Because this is a church-wide initiative, you are already involved through your financial and moral support. BUT... if you want to be even more involved, the CHALICE program is comprised of individual initiatives where volunteer and leaders both expressed an interest. As the outreach arm of the church, the Helen Fogg Service Committee is also part of CHALICE, but not the whole thing! We are providing support, helping individuals contribute and updating the congregation on progress. Your Service Committee chooses charities for Outreach Sundays-this year we have chosen charities which align with the CHALICE projects. Most recently we have helped children and families through your generous donations to South Shore Peer Recovery and race relations through NAACP-Brockton.

In addition to the NAACP donation toward Race Relations, there will be a Standing Up For Racial Justice program organized for **Sunday, March 26** at 3 pm. This SURJ program will show the movie *13th* and a SURJ

speaker will come and talk with us. More details soon. Hope you'll come!

The Helping Children and Families group has been working on organizing a "Kids Closet" in the church attic for foster families. Children in foster care are often removed from their home with only the clothes on their back, leaving foster families to scramble to find clothing and other supplies. Our goal is to provide immediate access to new and used clothing, new underwear and socks, diapers, etc., to help ease the stress of transition. We will be starting a collection soon for the following items: diapers, new underwear, new and gently used kids clothing (especially for infants and boys of all sizes). As a great example of the synergy of CHALICE, our Religious Education team is continuing to accept donations for their Cradles to Crayons trip on **Saturday, March 25**. A full wish list of needed items is posted over the collection bin in the hallway outside the Meetinghouse.

Marcia Babcock and Bev Gardner are leading the CHALICE group "Reintegrating People into Society". This group has 3 people interested in joining a Partakers team meaning more volunteers, male and female, are needed to complete the teams! This project team is also working to acquaint nearby churches with Partakers. Jim Pickel has crafted a letter to the governing boards of churches explaining Partakers and offering to give a short presentation to them in person about this wonderful social justice group. We will then have a program in the Spring for those churches which are interested in becoming affiliated with Partakers. Currently the Reintegrating team is acquainting parishioners with the "Mass. Bail Fund" and is supporting the local "Stand Up for Racial Justice Group", to sponsor the documentary "13th" at church along with a speaker.

Our CHALICE team working on Preventing Gun Violence has been organizing ideas around this topic and deciding which direction we want to take. In December, along with our neighboring UCC church, this team hosted a vigil on Norwell Town Common to end gun violence.

The vigil was in remembrance of victims and in determination to save lives moving forward. On **Sunday, March 26**, our committee will host an Outreach Sunday service with a speaker from a STOP HANDGUN VIOLENCE which is a Boston based non-profit organization working toward preventing firearm violence through public awareness, sensible legislation and support for law enforcement without banning guns.

The CHALICE LGBTQ Issues team has focused so far this year on the renewal of FPNUU's commitment to being a Welcoming Congregation. This involves re-examining the goals first established by this congregation back in 1999, to be inclusive in language, education and worship, for members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer/questioning community. Our committee will be hosting a LGBTQ Dance on **Saturday, April 1** in our Parish Hall for the youth on the South Shore. Our Outreach Sunday will be in June where our guest speaker will be a representative from SShAGLY (South Shore Alliance for Gay and Lesbian Youth).

Even without a CHALICE team at our church, Climate and Environment action and education is available. This year on **Sunday, March 12** at 3 pm in our own Meetinghouse, we will host an afternoon UU Union Celebration including our Union Sunday congregations. Please join us for "Singing for the Earth", featuring UU minister, folk singer, and climate activist Fred Small. This event is for all ages (including activities for the very young) and will celebrate the earth through uplifting song and inspiring words, moving us from hope to action.

Please check out the CHALICE board on Sunday and see which of the areas interest you. If during the church year you would like to have a say in how we do outreach in our community, please join us! Meetings are at 11:30 after Coffee Hour, usually the second Sunday of each month. Why not join us and check us out? Questions? Ask any committee member!
