

facilitated by Deanna Riley and attended by me, Julian, Amanda Metzger and Bev Gardner. At that meeting we decided a variety of things:

- Our purpose would be to use Facebook as a communication tool for our congregation and the larger world (thinking about First Parish's goal of wanting to be a larger presence in the wider community).
- We assigned days for posting to various people along with general topics so we would cover general events, RE, Minister's Choice, the larger UU community, and the posting of our iSpi.
- We decided on a couple of format issues—we would try to post 1-5 pictures/graphic images along with any announcements since pictures attract attention and we would start "photo albums" at another place on our page to collect any other photos and so that our congregation would have the chance to see all of our children and events in fuller detail. (Who doesn't like to see photos of their family and friends?)
- We also decided that we would tag folks, with the option to "opt out" because that would give our Facebook a wider viewing.

And then . . . many in our congregation let us know that they did not want to be tagged. A few didn't want to have their photos on Facebook either, and we know this is not allowed for foster children in our midst. So we started a list of those folks, and when we saw how long that list was getting, we re-evaluated. As a result, *there will be no more tagging on Facebook*. The people have spoken and we listened. ☺ We are still keeping the list of those who wanted to "opt out" of being in photos on Facebook and if you'd like to add your name to that list, please contact Hope in our office. Oh, and one more thing. If you want to look at our Facebook page but don't have a Facebook account yourself, there's a link in the top right corner of our home page on the church's website at www.firstparishnorwell.org. Just click on the little "f" and you'll have access.

Wednesday, August 3: The Life and Times of the Thunderbolt Kid by Bill Bryson

This is a "...a deeply funny new memoir of growing up in the curious world of the 1950's" by the author of A Walk in the Woods. Nostalgic for those born before 1950,

and a slice of American social history for those born later.

Wednesday, September 7: Our Souls at Night by Kent Haruf

"...a low-key, evocative short novel about the pursuit of happiness, second chances and, perhaps most importantly, about our deep emotional need of companionship and intimacy". You can read this short novel in one or two sittings -- a good book to begin the church year.

Wednesday, October 5: The Boys in the Boat by Daniel James Brown

This book "celebrates the 1936 men's Olympic 8-oar rowing team -- 9 working class boys from the University of Washington who stormed the rowing world, transformed the sport and galvanized the attention of millions of Americans. In an extraordinary race in Berlin they stunned the Aryan sons of the Nazi state as they rowed for gold in front of Adolf Hitler." Don't miss this year's family day on the north river or the pizza party in the evening! We'll have our church fellowship on the North River on **Sunday, July 31**, followed by a late afternoon pizza party at the home of Peter and Roberta Fairbanks. Both parts of the day are for all ages. Here are the specifics:

9:45 am: Meet at the Bridge Street/Union Street canoe launch on the Marshfield side of the river. Bring your canoe or kayak and a picnic lunch. (Don't forget paddles, life preservers, and sunblock!)

10:00 am: Leave the canoe launch and paddle upstream to the picnic and swimming beach at the Couch property in Marshfield. We'll be going WITH the tide- much easier and more fun!!

11:30 am - 12:30 pm (estimated): Swim and picnic at the Couch property. We'll leave when the tide turns.

12:30 or 1:00 pm: Start back WITH the tide. *Optional: Stop at the home of Ralph and Betsy Gordon (short break, beautiful location, bathroom available).* Return to the canoe launch and your car. Take a few hours to relax at home, then come to the Pizza Party.

5:00 pm: Family pizza party at the home of Peter and Roberta Fairbanks (1243 Union Street, Marshfield). Bring \$5.00 per person for pizza and an appetizer or dessert to share. Judy's current work deals with an abstract idea of the currents, forces and energy that move around the earth. Be it oceanic gyres, typhoons, winds, rivers, fish shoaling, birds flocking, leaves falling; everything feels a pulse and a rhythm. She has tried to depict this feeling of involuntary movement, natural flow that affects living creatures everywhere. It may even be a metaphor for human flight and the change in global weather patterns. She tries for a minimalist approach, using repetitive marks that build upon each other and flow around the painted ground. Some mimic shoaling fish or bird flight.
